

MULTILINGUAL EXCELLENCE: Claudia Lockwood

Claudia Lockwood has spent her entire professional career in the area of the education of English Learners. She was an ESL teacher and district resource teacher in Linden, California for 15 years. She joined the San Joaquin County Office of Education in 1988 as a Title VII Resource Teacher, working with 7 school districts throughout the county to implement and develop ELD and bilingual programs. In 1992 she was appointed Director of Multilingual Education at SJCOE. In this position she developed an office that served as professional development leader for teachers of English Learners in the metropolitan Stockton, Sacramento, and Modesto as well as for the surrounding rural areas. She administered the largest Bilingual Teacher Training Project in the state, providing examination preparation and language classes to educators in 23 Northern California counties. Claudia Lockwood retired as Director of Multilingual Education in 2009. She has continued to work in the field of education of English Learners as a part-time consultant with SJCOE and independently. Her work includes serving as a statewide trainer for the CELDT and as an expert consultant for the CELDT in scoring oral and written responses. She assists districts with Title III plan development and implementation. She also worked as a part-time consultant for the Commission on Teacher Credentialing.
